<u>Miyawaki Forest Symposium, Yokohama - A Compelling Method for</u> <u>Greening Urban Spaces</u>

Developed by Professor Akira Miyawaki, the Miyawaki method harnessed native flora to rapidly re-green areas as small as 3m². From 10-14 October 2024, the G20 Global Land Initiative partnered with experts and the Japanese government to conduct a symposium on Miyawaki forests, their potential in both rural and urban spaces, and discussed their use as nature labs in Japanese schools.
